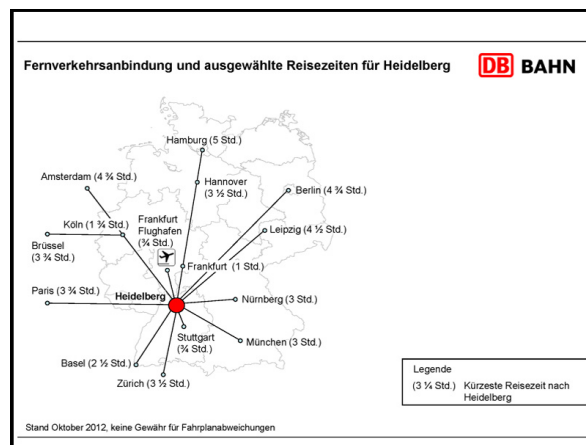

1 Arrival to Heidelberg

Depending on your mode of transportation and starting location, there are numerous ways to get to us. Heidelberg is located in the Rhein-Neckar region, about 100 km south of Frankfurt/Main. Here we present a few options to help you plan but please bear in mind that this information may be/become out of date or invalid due to external factors.



1.1 By train

1.2 By plane (nearest airports)

1.2.1 Train

The train ride from Frankfurt airport to Heidelberg takes about one hour and may involve changing trains either at the main station in Frankfurt or in Mannheim. A one-way ticket costs approximately 25€. For train schedules check out [here](#)

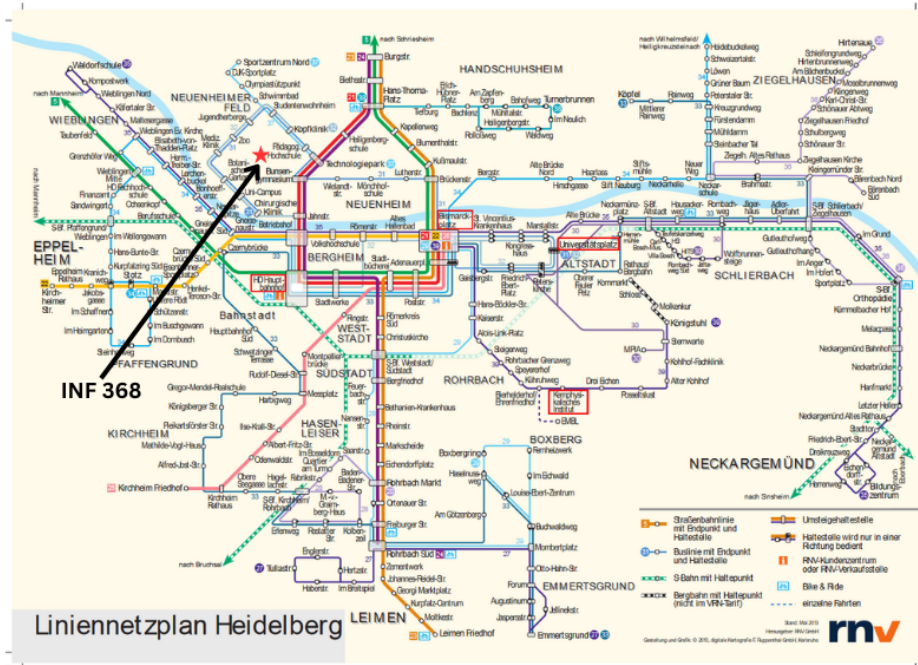
1.2.2 Shuttle/Bus/Taxi

It is also possible to take the Lufthansa Airport Shuttle from Frankfurt airport to Heidelberg. The bus route terminates at the Crowne Plaza Hotel on Kurfürstenanlage. A single ticket costs €25 and is payable to the driver in cash. Buses run every hour between 7:00 am and 10:30 pm and can be found right across from the Frankfurt Airport Meeting Point in Terminal 1, THE SQUAIRE WEST(next to Fernbahnhof, Exit REWE). Seats can only be guaranteed if you reserve three days prior to your arrival. The exact bus schedule and information on reservation procedures are available here. Perhaps the most convenient way to get to Heidelberg is to order a shuttle mini bus run by the company TLS. A staff member of TLS picks you up at the airport and takes you to Heidelberg. The taxi has to be booked at least two days beforehand, a one-way ticket costs about €40. Further information is available on the Internet: [here](#). Additionally, shuttles are also available and the arriving passengers will only be picked up from the Meeting Point in Terminal 1 ([frankfurt-airport-shuttles](#)). 1.3 By car

Motorway A5 / A 656 (via Darmstadt, direction: Karlsruhe/Basel), exit at Heidelberg motorway interchange or at “Heidelberg/Schwetzingen”

2.1 By public transport

Tickets can be bought online [here](#) or can be bought in person from several ticket booths available at almost all stations. On the buses you can buy tickets from the driver and on the trams there is an automat to buy tickets from.

- **Tram lines 21 and 24**

Stop “Jahnstraße”: To change to bus line 32, please go from the tram stop on Jahnstraße into Neuenheimer Feld, the bus stop is about 30 m on the right-hand side of the street.

“Technology Park” stop: Change to bus lines 31 and 37 at the same stop.
